DID YOU KNOW? People's United operates two charitable foundations—People's United Community Foundation and People's United Community Foundation of Eastern Massachusetts.

People's United Bank foundations act as philanthropic arms for the bank. The People's United Community Foundation and the People's United Community Foundation of Eastern Massachusetts invest in programs that enhance the quality of life for our friends and neighbors living in the communities we serve.



In 2015, People's United Community Foundation and People's United Community Foundation of Eastern Massachusetts, together awarded more than \$3.2 million to 482 nonprofits organizations throughout the People's United Bank footprint.

People's United Community Foundation awarded more than \$2.5 million to 391 non-profit organizations in Connecticut, New York, Massachusetts, Vermont, New Hampshire and Maine. Funding was distributed within the foundation's three areas of focus, with 39% allocated to community development, 33% to youth development, and 21%t to affordable housing initiatives.

The People's United Community Foundation also contributed seven percent of its funding to local United Way organizations across its footprint through the People's United Bank employee match campaign. For more information on People's United Community Foundation, visit <u>pucf.org</u>.

People's United Community Foundation of Eastern Massachusetts awarded nearly \$720,000 to 91 nonprofits within the 27 communities it serves in Eastern Massachusetts. People's United Community Foundation of Eastern Massachusetts operates three community-based programs, including the Neighborhood Fund, Malden Community Fund Program, and Community Grant Program. People's United Community Foundation Provides Schools in Northeast with Gift of Classroom Supplies

In the spirit of holiday giving and the New Year, PUCF teamed up with DonorsChoose.org, at the end of 2015, to surprise students and teachers throughout the Northeast with \$100.000 worth of classroom supplies.

A unique charity created to support public school teachers, DonorsChoose.org provides educators with an online venue to submit classroom project requests describing muchneeded school supplies for their students. The public can then browse the projects and choose those they would like to support.



People's United Community Foundation provided \$100,000

to DonorsChoose.org to fund 100 percent of the cost of classroom projects that met its criteria, with a focus on financial literacy and STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) education. A total of 213 projects were funded through the grant, reaching nearly 200 teachers and more than 15,000 students across Connecticut, New York, Massachusetts, Vermont, New Hampshire, and Maine.

"People's United Community Foundation is delighted to help make the holidays brighter for students and teachers with a gift of much-needed classroom materials throughout the Northeast," said Karen Galbo, Director of People's United Community Foundation. "Financial Literacy and STEM education play a key role in helping students obtain 21st century skills, which are sought after by employers and critical for competing in a global economy. We hope our gift will spark students' interest in learning throughout the New Year and beyond."

People's United Community Foundation has partnered with DonorsChoose.org since 2010, providing \$450,000 in support of initiatives in school districts across the People's United Bank footprint. More than 1,200 classroom projects have been funded through this partnership.

People's United Employees Volunteer To Teach JA In A Day



Junior Achievement of Western Connecticut provides financial literacy, college and career readiness, and entrepreneurship programs to over 22,000 students in grades K-12 in sixteen communities in the Greater Bridgeport, Greater Danbury and Lower Naugatuck Valley communities.

JA's curriculum is purposefully designed to create the greatest impact through its focus on hands-on activities, experiential learning and sequential delivery. JA programs start in kindergarten, at the beginning of a child's formal education, and continue through

high school. Constant reinforcement that enhances academic relevancy is the key for keeping youth committed to finishing their education and gaining the skills necessary to be successful in the 21st century. Teachers welcome JA in their classrooms due to JA programs being supplemental to traditional school curriculum, while remaining aligned with Connecticut's Education Content Standards.

In addition to program support from People's United Community Foundation, each year, for over two decades, People's United Bank employees volunteer to teach JA programs and have been positive role-models for students attending High Horizon School in Bridgeport.

This past December, a team People's United Bank employees spent the day at High Horizon School inspiring 407 students in grades K-8 with lessons of hope, the importance of staying in school, personal finance, and the skills necessary to succeed in today's workforce. A participating eighth grade student stated he learned, "skills necessary for a future occupation and that managing money is vital for staying financially stable."

CAREERS' Site-based Internship Program Prepares Students for Jobs After Graduation

Students with disabilities are learning what it takes to be successful in the workplace as they participate in CAREERS for People with Disabilities Site-Based Internship Program that helps bridge the gap from the classroom to the workplace.

CAREERS finds productive employment for individuals with learning, intellectual, developmental, psychiatric and/or physical disabilities in Westchester and Putnam Counties, New York. CAREERS provides extensive on-the-job training and ongoing support services, while educating employers and the community about the benefits of hiring workers with disabilities.



New York Presbyterian Hudson Valley Hospital Center is the jobsite for Putnam Valley High School student Ryan M., (left). With daily support from CAREERS staff, Ryan learned tasks to support the Marketing Department. "He is truly an amazing person; friendly, outgoing, just what we needed," said Tonja Inlaw, Director of Volunteer Services at the Hospital. "I didn't know what to expect, but he is a phenomenal worker. It has been a good experience for us as well!" Ryan will continue interning in other hospital departments for the rest of the school year, with CAREERS assisting him in finding a job after graduation.

Students from New Rochelle High have also been participating in CAREERS' Site-Based Internship Program for the past three years at locations including Montefiore Medical Center. This past fall, students learned financial skills, including how to write checks and make bank deposits, as well as soft skills such as getting along with management and co-workers.



The students also took a field trip to Monkey Pod Games in Mamaroneck, where owner Gilad Levy, (pictured third from right), conducted mock job interviews and provided feedback for the students on their performance. A trip to the Department of Motor Vehicles to obtain legal photo identification was another outing for the high school students, to help them prepare to be part of the workforce after graduation.

CAREERS has expanded its program at Carmel High School for students interested in pursuing a CDOS (Career Development and Occupational Studies) credential in addition to a diploma. CAREERS is connecting students with required work-based hours by setting up internships at local businesses including Putnam Hospital Center, Northern Smoke BBQ Restaurant, Sayegh Law Office and Putnam Humane Society.



Third Sector New England Report on Nonprofits

Third Sector New England (TSNE), which serves nonprofit organizations throughout New England and across the country, provides management and leadership resources, and capacity-building programs and services focused on strengthening nonprofits.

TSNE recently conducted a study on nonprofit leadership in New England. Surveying nearly 900 leaders, including executive directors and board members of nonprofits, TSNE reported, that although nonprofits have exhibited remarkable resiliency over the past decade, the sector faces unsustainable trends including, overworked and underpaid leaders and staff, ongoing battle of balancing budgets with unstable funding sources, and lack of funding for professional development and growth.

These challenges, along with key findings in the report, pose risks as well as opportunities for nonprofits to prepare for the challenges of a changing sector, as we embark on the biggest generational shift in this country as boomers retire.
