YOU CAN MAKE A LIFE-CHANGING DIFFERENCE!

Your gift is extremely important because it provides resources that make an immediate impact by helping us through these tough times. We can only provide our unique services if we raise enough money to bridge the gap created by funding cuts from federal, state and county sources. Each year, we receive less money for our programs, which means we need to fundraise more. This year that means raising approximately \$150,000 just to meet our budget, which we've kept at the same level — without any salary or cost-of-living increases for the staff — for five years in a row. Your tax-deductible donation will help us overcome this gap!!

Because 85% of our funding comes from state and local government, the recent recession and governmental cutbacks have hit us hard. Some facts:

- 85% of our revenue goes directly towards paying for job training, placement and support.
- Only 13% of our revenue pays for general and administrative costs.
- On average, we provide services to 450 individuals with disabilities each year.

- Over the past 3 years we have helped record numbers of clients retain their jobs at unprecedented levels, in spite of an increase in the unemployment rate among the non-disabled population.
